I am writing to formally object to the proposed cell tower development at 62 Granite Springs Road. Please ensure this opposition is conveyed to both the Town Board and the Conservation Board, and kindly confirm receipt of this message.

My primary concern, especially for the Conservation Board, is the severe environmental impact. The plan proposes disturbing over 28,000 square feet of land, including 15,627 square feet within critical wetlands buffer zones. This area provides vital habitat for endangered species such as the bog turtle, monarch butterfly, and Indiana bat.

This parcel is not merely local; it's a crucial component of the NYC watershed and directly drains into Sparkle Lake, a community resource for swimming and fishing. The planned removal of over 80 mature trees, essential for stormwater management, combined with extensive land disruption, gravely threatens water quality in Sparkle Lake and the Croton watershed. Such degradation could also imperil our community's valuable grants from the East of Hudson Water Quality Fund.

I urge both Boards to thoroughly consider the adverse effects on our habitats, wildlife, and residents. Specifically, I request the Conservation Board visit the site during warmer months to appreciate its ecological significance firsthand. Furthermore, I ask that the Boards mandate an independent wildlife study, funded by the developer and overseen by a Conservation Board-selected expert, to provide an impartial ecological assessment.
