Please forward my letter in opposition to the Town Board, the Planning Board and the Conservation Board. Please also confirm receipt of my letter by emailing me back.

I would like the Town Board, the Planning Board and Conservation Board to consider **requesting Homeland Towers do a Balloon Test at 62 Granite Springs Road prior to granting a permit.**

The visual impact of a 130 foot monopole on alienated park land is going to be significant. This will be magnified due to it being built in a residential and scenic area. Camouflaging is not being proposed and would not mitigate its visual presence.

All residents, town board members and committees being asked to provide a permit, should receive the benefit of a ballon test to help them visualize the proposed cell tower's impact on the landscape.
