Dear Town Supervisor and Members of the Town Board,

I am writing to formally express my opposition to the proposed cell tower on Granite Springs Road.

While I recognize the importance of reliable wireless coverage, I am concerned that this project places a disproportionate burden on a residential area while offering limited demonstrated benefit to the broader community. A structure of this scale fundamentally alters the character of the neighborhood and raises serious concerns regarding aesthetics, property values, and environmental impact.

The proposed site's proximity to homes and sensitive natural areas, including nearby wetlands, warrants heightened scrutiny. Construction activity, tree removal, and long-term infrastructure in such locations risk lasting environmental consequences. Additionally, many residents reasonably worry about the negative effect a highly visible tower may have on property desirability and home values, an impact that cannot easily be reversed.

If coverage gaps truly exist, I urge the Town to more fully explore alternative solutions that are less intrusive, including smaller-scale installations, alternative siting, or co-location opportunities that minimize disruption to established neighborhoods.

I respectfully request that the Town Board reconsider this proposal or, at minimum, delay any decision until residents are provided with clearer data regarding need, alternatives, environmental impacts, and long-term consequences.
