#### NY CATSKILL AQUEDUCT BUILDING – LAND USE PERMIT

Yorktown Water Distribution Superintendent David Rambo stated that the Town used to use a building on New York City property when it received its water from the Catskills. Today, the Town of Yorktown receives it water via two filtration systems. In order for his department to remove the equipment in this building which will eventually be torn down, the Town of Yorktown must apply for a Land Use Permit.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to NY Town Law §§ 82 and 90, within ten (10) days from the date of this Resolution the Town Clerk shall post and publish a notice which shall set forth the date of the adoption of the Resolution, shall contain an abstract of such Resolution concisely setting forth the purpose and effect thereof, shall specify that this Resolution was adopted subject to a permissive referendum; and shall publish such notice in the Yorktown News, a newspaper published in the County having a general circulation in the Town of Yorktown, and in addition thereto that the Town Clerk shall post or cause to be posted on the sign-board of the Town of Yorktown, a copy of such notice within ten (10) days after the date of the adoption of this Resolution, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that if 30 days after publication and posting of the above-described notice, this Resolution has not been challenged by permissive referendum, the Town Supervisor shall be authorized to sign a lease with the Tenant.

#### PROPOSED LOCAL LAW, RETAIL CHECK- OUT BAGS

Mr. Scott Rein explained that communities such as Larchmont and Mamaroneck have instituted laws banning retail plastic bags. He asked the Board to consider enacting a similar law.

Discussion by the Board including Councilman Patel stating that the Town of Yorktown has a good track record on recycling. He further stated that we can and will encourage our residents to recycle. Councilman Bianco stated that several supermarkets have areas where residents are encouraged to recycle plastic bags. Supervisor Grace stated that he will not consider this type of proposal, he will not tell companies how to run their businesses.

The discussion ended with the proposal being rejected by the majority of the Board.

#### 2579 BARRY COURT

Mr. & Mrs. Abbate along with their Engineer, Tracy Chalifoux provided the Board with an outline of the project stating that this was for the installation of a 16' by 32' in-ground swimming pool and patio.

The Town Board asked if there was any flooding in the area.

Mr. Abbate stated that they have not lived in the house very long, but they haven't seen any flooding in the area.

Mr. Bruce Barber, the Town Wetlands Consultant explained that he has seen this application. This application calls for work to be done within five feet of the buffer area.

Supervisor Grace stated that this type of activity should get an administrative approval from the Town Engineer rather than coming before the Town Board. In addition to refer this

application for a permit, he would like a proposed local law permitting this type of application to be approved administratively.

#### **ILLINGTON ROAD**

Supervisor Grace read the comments received relating to Mrs. Saunders request to purchase town-owned property. The Conservation Board opposes the alienation of park land. The Yorktown Land Trust, in its response talks about discussions with the Committee on Open Space where the possibility of an exchange was discussed. The Saunders family would purchase a parcel of open space of roughly comparable size. The property would then be donated to the Town of Yorktown and dedicated as parkland.

Mr. Paul Moskowitz, the co-chairman of the Committee on Open Space stated that his committee spoke about two options; Supervisor Grace just spoke about one and the second option was not alienating parkland.

Supervisor Grace stated that he would like to continue this conversation with the Land Trust.

Councilman Bianco stated that he is opposed to the alienation of parkland.

#### GREENWOOD STREET HILL

Highway Superintendent David Paganelli explained that R & S has done a lot of the work that they agreed to. Unfortunately, there have been some equipment failures, but for the most part, the company is doing an excellent job. They have not processed any commercial work for six weeks. Superintendent Paganelli would like the agreement extended. He will have the Request for Proposal for this work done within the next two weeks.

APPROVE EXTENSION OF THE EXISTING AGREEMENT WITH R&S WASTE SERVICES, LLC RESOLUTION #356

Upon motion made by Councilman Murphy, seconded by Councilman Bianco,

The Board and the applicant continue to explore options concerning entering and exiting the applicant's site which is on Route 6 and Strawberry Road. The issue of a by-pass and/or the applicant purchasing additional property were discussed.

The applicant asked the Town Board if there was any interest in this project which in addition to offering senior care for less than what is being charged at the Field Home Complex, they would also offer courses taught by instructors from Mercy College.

A majority of the Board indicated that they would be interested in this proposal, but the applicant should continue looking at different options on entering and exiting the development.
