WHEREAS, the Town of Yorktown desires to prepare a New York State Consolidated Funding application to apply to the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation & Historic Preservation Environmental Protection Fund to request additional funds that would qualify as part of the Town match portion of the NYS DOT grant; and

WHEREAS, the grant request is for \$73,940.00 and with a 50% local match required, \$73,941.00 will be the responsibility of the Town;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Yorktown Town Board authorizes the Planning Department to submit a New York State Consolidated Funding application to apply for a grant from the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation & Historic Preservation Environmental Protection Fund in the amount of \$73,940.00 for restoration of the Yorktown Heights Railroad Station building.

TRAILWAY CONNECTION

WHEREAS, the Town of Yorktown desires to prepare a New York State Consolidated Funding Application to apply to the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation & Historic Preservation Environmental Protection Fund and Recreational Trails Grant Programs for a grant to fund construction of a trailway connection from Railroad Park to Franklin Delano Roosevelt State Park; and

DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION PROJECT

A LOCAL LAW to amend Article III of Chapter 200 of the Code of the Town of Yorktown entitled "LIGHTING, OUTDOOR," to provide authority to approval board to modify and waive requirements.

Be it enacted by the town board of the town of Yorktown as follows:

Section I. Statement of Authority.

This local law is authorized by the New York State Constitution, the provisions of the New York Municipal Home Rule Law, the relevant provisions of the Town Law of the State of New York, the laws of the Town of Yorktown and the general police power vested with the Town of Yorktown to promote the health, safety and welfare of all residents and property owners in the Town.

Section II. Section 200-7A of the Town Code of the Town of Yorktown is hereby amended by the addition of the following new paragraph (5):

(5) Modification and waiver. The approval authority, upon finding that due to special conditions of a site certain requirements of Section §200-6 of this chapter are unsuitable for the site or incompatible with a plan of development, may vary or waive said requirements, provided that such variance or waiver will not be detrimental to the public health, safety, or welfare, or have the effect of nullifying the intent and purpose of the adopted Zoning Map, the Zoning Ordinance, the Comprehensive Plan, or this Chapter 200. In varying or waiving such conditions the approval authority may specify such conditions that will, in its judgement, secure substantially the objectives of the requirements so varied or waived.

Section III. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, phrase, paragraph or any part of this local law shall for any reason be adjudicated finally by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation and effect to the clause, sentence, phrase, paragraph or part thereof, directly involved in the controversy or action in which such judgment shall have

been rendered. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that the remainder of this local law would have been adopted had any such provisions been excluded.

Section IV. Repeal

All ordinances, local laws and parts thereof inconsistent with this Local Law are hereby repealed.

Section V. Effective Date.

This local law shall become effective upon filing in the office of the Secretary of State in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

A LOCAL LAW to amend Chapter 275 of the Code of the Town of Yorktown entitled "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," Article I, entitled "Traffic and Parking Regulations," adding a full stop at intersection of Summit Street and Underhill Avenue

Be it enacted by the town board of the town of Yorktown as follows:

Section VI. Statement of Authority.

This local law is authorized by the New York State Constitution, the provisions of the New York Municipal Home Rule Law, the relevant provisions of the Town Law of the State of New York, the laws of the Town of Yorktown and the general police power vested with the Town of Yorktown to promote the health, safety and welfare of all residents and property owners in the Town.

Section VII. Section 275-6A in Chapter 275, entitled "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," Article I, of the Town Code, entitled "Traffic and Parking Regulations," is hereby amended by adding the following location to the list of public highways upon which a driver of a vehicle shall come to a full stop unless otherwise directed by a peace officer:

Summit Street at the southeast corner of the intersection with Underhill Avenue

Section VIII. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, phrase, paragraph or any part of this local law shall for any reason be adjudicated finally by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation and effect to the clause, sentence, phrase, paragraph or part

thereof, directly involved in the controversy or action in which such judgment shall have been rendered. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that the remainder of this local law would have been adopted had any such provisions been excluded.

Section IX. Repeal

All ordinances, local laws and parts thereof inconsistent with this Local Law are hereby repealed.

Section X. Effective Date.

This local law shall become effective upon filing in the office of the Secretary of State in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

A LOCAL LAW to amend Chapter 275 of the Code of the Town of Yorktown entitled "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," Article I, entitled "Traffic and Parking Regulations," amending section 275-17 to add a park zone at Ivy Knolls Park

Be it enacted by the town board of the town of Yorktown as follows:

Section XI. Statement of Authority.

This local law is authorized by the New York State Constitution, the provisions of the New York Municipal Home Rule Law, the relevant provisions of the Town Law of the State of New York, the laws of the Town of Yorktown and the general police power vested with the Town of Yorktown to promote the health, safety and welfare of all residents and property owners in the Town.

Section XII. Section 275-17E in Chapter 275, entitled "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," Article I, of the Town Code, entitled "Traffic and Parking Regulations," is hereby amended by adding the following location to the list of park zones:

- (h) Ivy Knolls Park:
- [1] "Entering Park Zone" sign on Ivy Road, 300 feet east of boundary of the park.
- [2] "Leaving Park Zone" sign on Ivy Road, southbound, 300 feet west of the boundary of the park.

Section XIII. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, phrase, paragraph or any part of this local law shall for any reason be adjudicated finally by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such

judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation and effect to the clause, sentence, phrase, paragraph or part thereof, directly involved in the controversy or action in which such judgment shall have been rendered. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that the remainder of this local law would have been adopted had any such provisions been excluded.
